The Zula Patrol gets a new DVD and adds new games and activities to its virtual world ZulaWorld.com this month. Distributed by Well Go USA, The Zula Patrol: Moons Mayhem DVD will be available from August 25 and contains six episodes of the series as well as a peek at ZulaWorld.com and 200 Zlinkles (the equivalent of US\$10) to spend on the site. New features on ZulaWorld.com include: Planet Mars adventures; Global Community Missions to search for missing grogs; a multiplayer Bumper Ship game; an online journal; open chat option, protected by Crisp NetModerator software (and yes, there is an opt out option).
